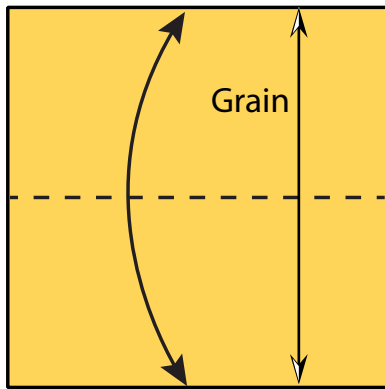
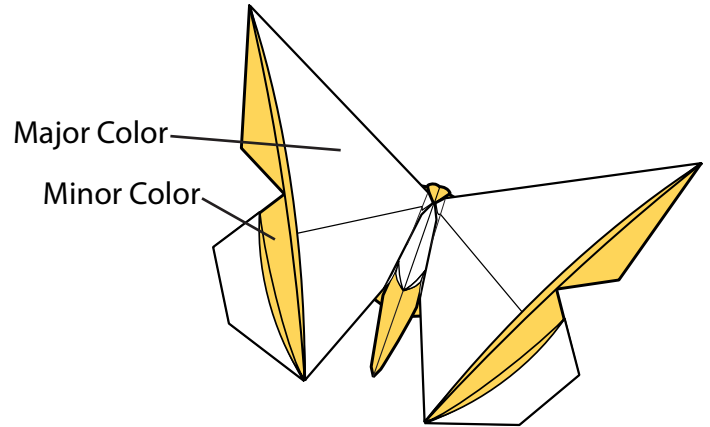

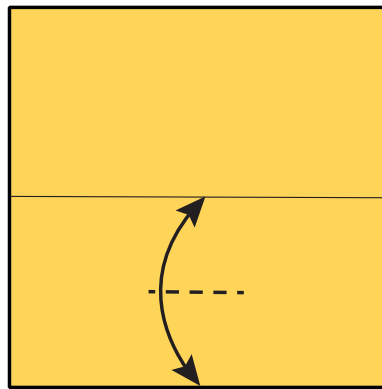
## Intermediate level

- A 15 cm square will produce a butterfly with a wingspan of approximately 11 cm.
- Begin with the Minor Color side up.

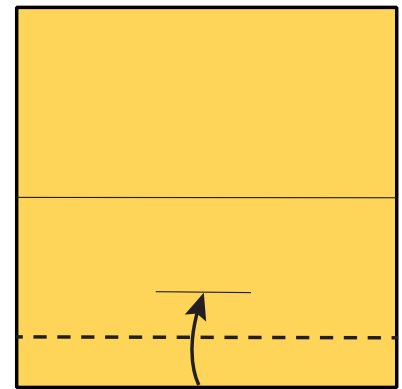
**Note:** It is best to begin with the paper's grain running vertically in step 1. This will facilitate forming the wings' crescent-shaped edges.

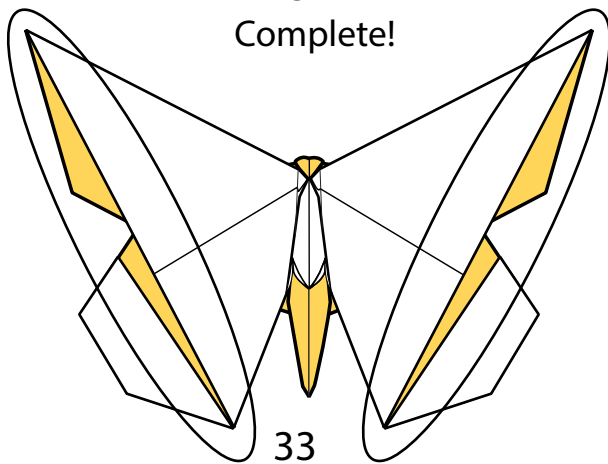
Detail for the thorax



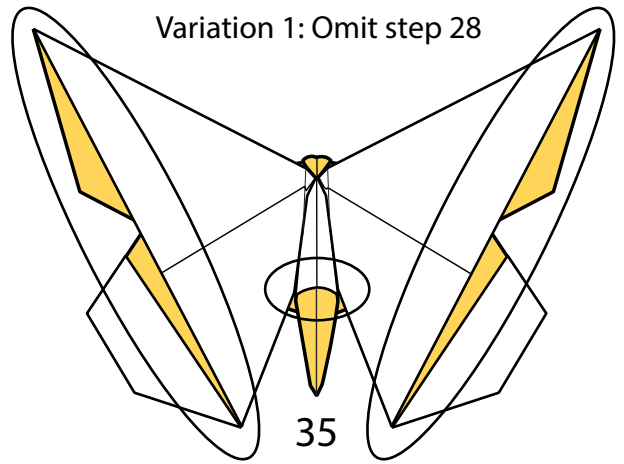
